


Establishment of Circuit Bench of Bombay High Court at Kolhapur : Need of the day

# Increasing number of judges and creation of new Benches.

- "In almost every High Court, there is huge pendency of cases and the present strength of the Judges can hardly be said to be sufficient to cope with the alarming situation. The Institution of cases is much more than the disposal and it adds to arrears of cases. The litigate citizens have a fundamental right of life i.e. a tension-free life through speedy justice delivery system".
- It is true that the new Benches will require money but it is necessary as a development measure, particularly when efforts are being made for all round development of the country.

# Increasing number of judges and creation of new Benches.

- It is also necessary that, the work of the High Courts is decentralized that is more Benches are established in all States. If there is manifold increase in judges and the staff, all cannot be housed in one campus. Therefore, the establishment of new Benches is necessary. It is also in the interest of litigants. The Benches should be so established that a litigant is not required to travellong.
- We must always keep in mind that existence of judges and Advocates is because of the litigants and they are there to serve their cause only.

#### **Establishment of Aurangabad Bench**

• Initially set-up for 7 Districts.

- The Power of Chief Justice of establishment of a Circuit Bench or Benches of High Court is enshrined in Sec. 51 (3) of the State Reorganizations Act, 1956
- O The establishment of Aurangabad Bench upheld on merits by Apex Court in the Judgment reported in 1982 (3) SCC 519.
- The distance from the Districts and Talukas of 6 Districts from the Principal seat at Mumbai ranges from 300 to 500 kms which is more than the Districts for which Aurangabad Bench is established.

#### **STATISTICS RELATING TO LITIGATION Of 6 Districts**

 25 % of pending litigation at Bombay High Court from 6 Districts.

• 22% yearly filing from 6 Districts at Bombay High Court.

- 20% litigants are unable to litigate further after District Court and hence are forced to give up their rights at the District level itself.
- Necessity to establish the Bench to repose faith of litigants on the Judicial system.


O 2,67,809 Cases are pending at present at Bombay High Court

#### Kolhapur Satisfies all the Norms

Central place for 5 Districts.

Distances :

- Kolhapur to Satara : 121 kms
  - Kolhapur to Mumbai : 400 kms
- Kolhapur to Sangli : 46 kms
  - Sangli to Mumbai : 390 kms
- Kolhapur to Ratnagiri : 165 kms
  - Satara to Mumbai : 275 kms
- Kolhapur to Sindhudurga : 120 kms
  - Sindhudurga to Mumbai : 490 kms
- Kolhapur to Solapur ( W) :- 234 kms
  - Solapur to Mumbai : 402 kms
  - Ratnagiri to Mumbai 400 kms

- Cost of stay and litigation in Mumbaivis-a-vis Kolhapur
- To reduce the burden on the Principal Bombay Bench.
- O Position of other States Karnataka, Tamilnadu, West Bengal, U.P.
- Unanimous support of all the Districts bars.
- Opportunity to litigants to personally remain present : Justice not only being done but seen to have been done.
- Lack of space for judges and staff at the Principal seat of Bombay
- 34 years of long pending demand making people impatient
- Era of decentralization all over the world.

 In the year 1937, for the then Deccan States, a Supreme Court was established at Kolhapur


## Alternative : Circuit Bench.
